### 2. Head of School (Sam Uzwack, Terry Macaluso)

- Expressed gratitude to the volunteers and families
- Admissions season is well underway
  - o Another record-breaking year with over 800 applications received across all grades
  - Our best marketing vehicle is our current families
  - We've extended offers for upper schools and are in the process of finalizing middle school decisions this week
  - We have far more qualified applicants than we do spots, unfortunately
  - We look closely at neurodiversity and student interests
  - We endeavor to create a balanced class of interesting humans who will collaborate as a team
  - After March 17<sup>th</sup>, we'll focus on welcoming new families and students. We don't just transition the student – we transition the whole family.
- Endowment: We're planning to hold small group meetings to launch a fundraising effort. An
  endowment will afford us the ability to grant more financial aid and secure needed
  resources.
- La Quinta Permanent Supportive Housing
  - We continue to make strong progress with both the City of Kirkland and King County
  - Sam attended the City Council meeting in January and voiced our need for resident screening given our border location
  - Upcoming meeting will review changes the County and City have made to the agreements
  - We're now in communication with the County in a similar way we have been with the City
  - We had a site visit with eight members of the county several weeks ago
  - City is working through operational details
  - Meeting this Thursday with the program owners to continue to push for screening and agreement changes
  - We expect the City to finalize the agreements this month. Then, the permitting
    process will begin. Renovations will be extensive and include adding a kitchen to
    each room. We're not anticipating occupants for many months (perhaps up to a
    year).
  - During the renovations, we will take the opportunity to fortify our security procedures and align our expectations with the operator once hired

### 4. Q&A

- Question: Are we getting a strong enrollment response from the upper school families we accepted? Are we receiving questions about La Quinta?
  - a. Sam: Yes, strong response. Don't have exact numbers. Had a new family meeting last week with high attendance. We're now moving to the wait pool, but we don't anticipate much movement there. Regarding La Quinta, Sam has been asked about it once or twice. Does not seem to have impacted the level of interest in our school given we had over 800 applications.
  - b. Vickie: We created an FAQ we presented to applicants so we were transparent about the project and potential impacts.

- Question: Is there anything we should know about Finals or the Final Schedule?
  - a. Sam: 3 classes on one day, 2 classes the next. We've been prepping the kids. John has been working with teachers to ensure that the focus that week is on exams and not other assignments. Maintaining the same schedule we've had the past few years.
- Question: Is there a way to schedule finals such that they don't conflict with SATs and ACTs?
  - a. Sam: We can look at it, but it's hard to coordinate this. Students can work with their advisors on their individual schedules.
- Question: What have our learnings been thus far with ChatGPT?
  - a. Sam: We aren't demonizing ChatGPT. We are experimenting and trying to figure out how to leverage its positive aspects rather than to resist it. Is this something that can help students and teachers with their craft? Students actually raised this issue to Dr. Stegeman and the school has responded.
- Question: Was there a reason why reading school days were replaced with regular?
  - a. Sam: I believe these are still on the books for Spring trimester.
- Question: What were the major take-aways on the School Assembly yesterday?
  - a. Sam was in an Admissions meeting. He will follow up with Dr. Stegeman.
- Question: How many new students will join the existing 9<sup>th</sup> grade class? Why does it seem like there are a lot of open spots in 9<sup>th</sup> right now?
  - a. Sam: We have 54 8<sup>th</sup> graders each year. We usually see four to five 8<sup>th</sup> graders attrit each year. This is a very low number. We add a significant number of new students in 9<sup>th</sup> because the social scene gets too familiar. We plan to add 25-30 new 9<sup>th</sup> graders. Target is 80 to 85 students in each upper school grade level. We have 83 9<sup>th</sup> graders, so there aren't many open spots if any. It is a critical balancing act. We also add a couple of 10<sup>th</sup> graders and perhaps one 11<sup>th</sup> grader if there is attrition.
- Question: Do we ever bring students in mid-year?
  - a. Vickie: We have in the past, but recently we haven't had any open spots. It's evaluated on a case-by-case basis.
- Question: What experiences can we cook up for the May 20<sup>th</sup> all-school celebration?
  - **a.** Vickie: There will be opportunities to create memories for Terry Macaluso! No dunk tank or bouncy house!
- Question: To reduce student stress, there has been discussion about changing our grading model. What is the status of this?
  - a. Sam: This may make its way into our strategic plan. Right now, it's difficult to talk about shifting our grading model without first defining our current practices and aligning on our overarching philosophy. We must ensure our grading practices are unified and rooted in EPS's overall mission and philosophy. Are grades a bell curve? Are they about setting a standard and achieving it? Is our culture about chasing a letter grade? Should a grade represent mastery of the skills and content of the discipline, or also reflect ancillary skills like turning things in on time? Are we sending the right message to our students with our current grading system, or are we simply telling them to do more? The other dimension is how we interface externally with colleges and universities, and what their expectations are.
- Question: Does EPS have an interest in providing life skill preparation to students who are preparing to transition to college (financial management, note-taking, laundry, etc.)?
  - a. Sam: We have opportunities during Senior Spring to explore this and what we can do to help facilitate students' transition to independent living.
